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8. SAVING GRACE Does your facial moisturizer's list of ingredients read like a science project? 7. MIX TAPE You might think that CDs and digital music have made cassette tapes obsolete, but designer Alyce Santoro has found an ingenious new use for them. She has recycled audiotape into a shiny fabric she's dubbed Sonic. Her over-the-shoulder messenger bags (\$80) come in eye-catching colors, and you can "play" Sonic fabric by running a tape head over it. 8. CULT FOLLOWING Araujo Estate's organic, biodynamic Cabs are so sought after, you can't even buy them from the vineyard. A tiny production is released each year to wine stores, restaurants and wine-list members (sorry, that list is closed). If you can't find it on the shelves at K&L, look for it (\$205-\$520/bottle) at such restaurants as Gary Danko (800 North Point St., 415-749-2060) or Frascati (1901 Hyde St., 415-928-1406).

9. BEECH BEAUTY City living becomes more bearable—and beautiful—with the Plasa room divider (\$5,748) from designer Emiliano Godoy. Made from FSC-certified beechwood and cotton rope, it's as no-nonsense as it is striking. *Branch*, 415-341-1824.

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
